



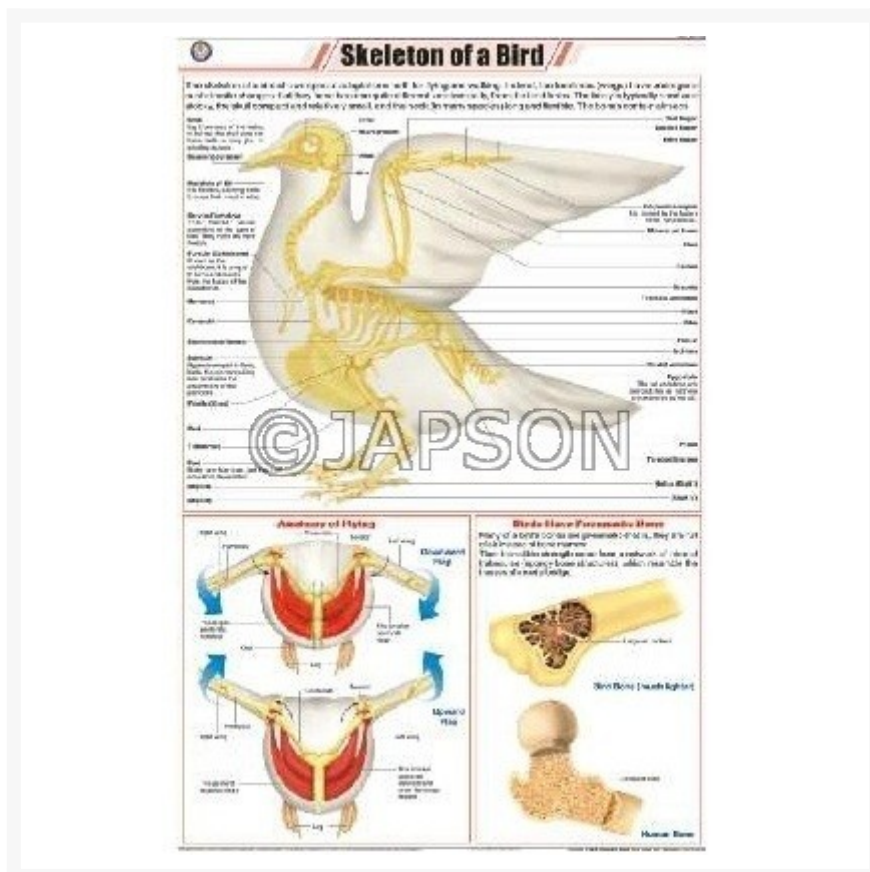

**Food Habits of Birds**

Birds eat assorted foods that are rich in energy and proteins. Many species eat more than one type of food whereas some birds feed entirely on a single kind of food. Birds also have seasonal changes in their diet to guarantee their survival.

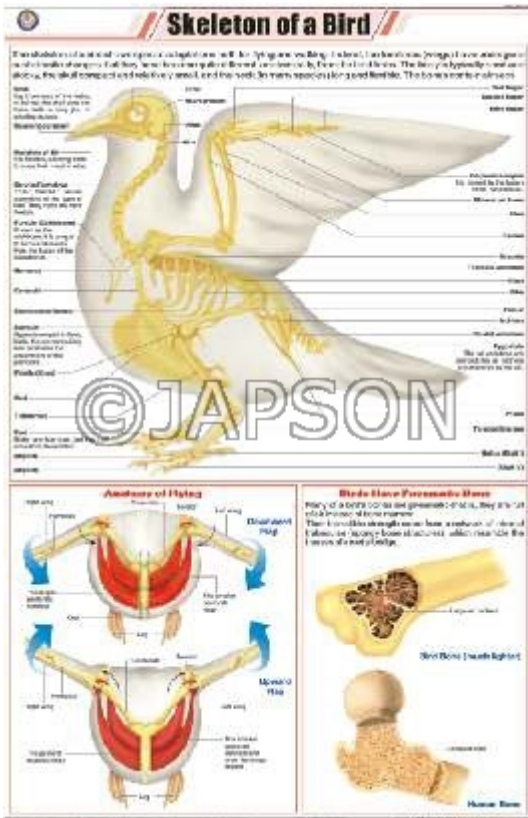
<p><b>Feeding on Prey (Raptorial)</b></p> <p>They hunt and eat small fast-moving insects, fish, birds, mammals and other birds along with other vertebrates.</p> <p>Examples: Hawk, Eagle, Osprey, Kingfisher, Falcon, etc.</p>	<p><b>Feeding on Carrion (Scavengers)</b></p> <p>They eat rotting. They may also eat garbage, waste, &amp; discarded (or) uneaten foods like sports equipment.</p> <p>Example: Vulture</p>
<p><b>Feeding on Insects (Insectivorous)</b></p> <p>They eat various insects like beetles, crickets, flies, bees, wasps, and spiders.</p> <p>Examples: Swift, Hummingbird, Flycatcher, etc.</p>	<p><b>Feeding on Fish (Piscivorous)</b></p> <p>They hunt and eat a wide range of fish. They also eat other aquatic animals like crabs, mollusks, and shellfish.</p> <p>Examples: Osprey, Kingfisher, Heron, Cormorant, etc.</p>
<p><b>Feeding Mainly on Fruits (Frugivorous)</b></p> <p>They eat various fruits like apples, oranges, pears, grapes, and berries.</p> <p>Examples: Parrot, Toucan, Kingfisher, etc.</p>	<p><b>Feeding on Grains &amp; Seeds (Granivorous)</b></p> <p>They eat various seeds and grains. Many granivorous birds, like songbirds, use their bills to crack open the seeds to get to the nutritious inner part.</p> <p>Examples: Parrot, Dove, Quail, etc.</p>
<p><b>Feeding on Nectar/Pollen/Sap (Nectarivorous)</b></p> <p>They feed on nectar, pollen, and sap from flowers and trees.</p> <p>Examples: Hummingbird, Nectar-eating Warbler, etc.</p>	<p><b>Feeding on Green Vegetation</b></p> <p>They eat various green plants like leaves, stems, and fruits.</p> <p>Examples: Parrot, Dove, Quail, etc.</p>
<p><b>Unrestricted Feeding (Omnivorous)</b></p> <p>They eat a wide range of food, including insects, fish, birds, mammals, and other vertebrates.</p> <p>Examples: Crow, Raven, etc.</p>	<p><b>Fiber Feeding</b></p> <p>They eat various types of fiber like twigs, bark, and other plant material.</p> <p>Examples: Woodpecker, etc.</p>

**Birth of a Bird's Chick**

- 1. THE EGG**  
The egg contains the embryo and yolk.
- 2. FERTILIZATION**  
The egg is fertilized by a sperm cell.
- 3. EARLY DEVELOPMENT**  
The embryo begins to divide and form.
- 4. THE EGG AND THE CHICK**  
The chick is visible inside the egg.
- 5. HATCHING**  
The chick is ready to break the shell.
- 6. CHICK IN THE EGG**  
The chick is fully developed inside the egg.
- 7. CHICK IN THE EGG**  
The chick is fully developed inside the egg.
- 8. GETTING OUT**  
The chick is hatching from the egg.
- 9. BREAKING THROUGH**  
The chick is breaking through the shell.
- 10. CHICK IN THE EGG**  
The chick is fully developed inside the egg.
